The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees of Jefferson Community College was called to order at 4:00 p.m., on Wednesday, December 7, 2016, in the Board Room, 6-220, Jules Center, Jefferson Community College, Watertown, New York, by Board Chair Terry Fralick.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion made by Judy Gentner, seconded by Mike Crowley, the minutes of the November 2 meeting were approved.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Chair Fralick offered privilege of the floor. No one came forward to address the Board.

UPDATE FROM THE FOUNDATION

Nate Hunter, Trustee representative on the Foundation Board, reported that sponsors were secured for the Home for the Holidays campaign, that the Jefferson Community School was nearly complete and that 257 scholarships had been awarded including 67 Jefferson-Can Community Scholars.

UPDATE FROM THE STUDENT TRUSTEE

Student Trustee Reganne Smith reported that Student Government is busy preparing for the Spring semester. Two club fairs and a blood drive are being planned for Spring. Students took part in an open forum on diversity and are interested in doing more open forums. SG is exploring ways to improve communications and increase event promotion to the student body. The SG constitution is undergoing some revisions. Lastly, residence life is preparing for the close of East Hall for the winter break.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1. President McCoy welcomed new Trustee David Males and outgoing Trustee Jim Scordo who will be recognized for his service to the Board later in the agenda. She introduced new Dean of Students, Rocco Cappello, and offered congratulations to Jefferson's Katy Troester-Trate and Trustee Nate Hunter for their recognition by NNY Business as two "20 under 40" leaders in our community.
2. President McCoy drew attention to the Fall Strategic Planning Update that had been posted for Trustees to review. The status of each initiative in the Strategic Plan is updated and effectiveness indicators are used to rate how well the College is progressing on achieving its goals.
3. President McCoy touched briefly upon the College's Diversity Plan which had been posted for Trustee review. She outlined the campus-wide process by which the plan was developed noting that it had been presented to Senate and will be submitted to SUNY for approval by the SUNY Board of Trustees. The plan will run concurrently with the College's current strategic plan.
4. Don Horton, director of the computer center, thanked the Board for the opportunity of his Spring 2017 sabbatical and provided a summary of his sabbatical spent exploring information systems security. During his sabbatical he earned the Certified Information Security Manager credential, audited the Banner system for security, enrolled Jefferson as a participant in SUNY's Security Operations Center and reviewed the College's security policies with a goal of developing standards around the policies.
5. Dan Dupee, Vice President for Administration & Finance provided the annual overview of Administration Division activities. He spoke briefly on recent activities, accomplishments and upcoming initiatives within the five areas of Facilities, Financial Operations, Human Resources & Finance, Institutional Technology and Institutional Research and Planning.
6. President McCoy provided the following additional updates:
 - Megan Stadler was scheduled to present on Supplemental Funding, but due to illness, her presentation has been moved to the January meeting.
 - The College received notification from the Office of the State Comptroller that it would be undergoing an audit.
 - College officials are still finalizing details of an agreement with Lewis County to provide non-credit workforce training in a new building to be constructed by Lewis County. The Lewis County Board of Legislators recently passed a resolution supporting the initiative. A similar resolution will be coming before the Jefferson Board of Trustees next.
 - President McCoy will be attending a meeting in January to discuss a possible events center in Jefferson County.
