The two transfer Individual Studies programs will be similar enough to the Liberal Arts Humanities and Social Sciences A.A. program should they be updated to meet the revised SUNY General Education in a manner that would be consistent with the other revisions currently underway. Additionally, as part of Jefferson's Guided Pathways work we have seen enrollment in these degrees decrease. It is Jefferson's goal to have students matriculated into a program designed specifically for their interest and transfer needs.

Since Jefferson regularly offers the coursework in these two proposed deactivated/discontinued programs, no concerns regarding student degree completion currently exists.

Jefferson does have a third Individual Studies degree, an AAS, that will be kept in order to provide a flexible option for military students and students desiring to make individual education plans. With SUNY Transfer Paths we believe the flexibility would also allow for students who wanted a transfer option to complete necessary coursework including the 7/30 general education requirements through the remaining AAS or another transfer option.
